## AMENDMENT TO CATEGORY SEVEN IN THE STREET COLLECTION POLICY

Proposed Action:

To amend the days listed within Category Seven of the Street Collection Policy for the charity collection held by the Royal British

Legion for this years' Poppy Appeal.

Purpose: To enable the Royal British Legion to collect on the Tuesday 9th

November, Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> November, Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> November and

two hours on Remembrance Sunday.

Justification for Urgent Action: The Camberley Branch of the British Legion has stated that they do not collect after the 11<sup>th</sup> November. As such the request is to enable the charity collection to take place on the Tuesday and Wednesday instead of the days allowed by the Policy, namely the Friday and

Saturday Of the same week.

Background: The current street collection policy only allows for the Royal British

Legion to conduct a charity collection on the Thursday, Friday and Saturday prior to Remembrance Sunday, which this year falls on the 14<sup>th</sup> November. The local branch of the British Legion has requested that because they do not collect after the 11<sup>th</sup> November, they would not be able to utilise the allowed days in full. The Collection Policy as it stands does not allow Officers to grant a Licence for the amended

collection days.

Proposal: To allow the Royal British Legion to amend two of their allocated days

this year from Friday 12th November and Saturday 13th November to

Tuesday 9th November, Wednesday 10th November.

Existing Policy: As advised above, the Council's street collections policy stipulates

British Legion Poppy collection days.

Corporate Policy:

The legislation provides for regulatory functions.

Legal Advice: Local Government legislation sets a framework for the regulation of

street collections. Local Authorities are required to licence all

collections taking place in a street or public place.
