SUMMARY

The report presents the application for a new Premises Licence relating to Tesco, 89-91 Guildford Road, Lightwater, Surrey, GU18 5SB. The Licensing authority is required to hold a hearing to determine this premises licence application because relevant representations have been received.

The purpose of the hearing is for the Licensing Sub-Committee to consider the Application, in relation to the Licensing Act 2003's Licensing Objectives. The Licensing objectives being in this Application:

- 1 The prevention of crime and disorder
- 2 Public safety
- 3 The prevention of public nuisance
- 4 The protection of children from harm

Copies of the application, relevant representations and other correspondence received to date are attached to this report.

The application is submitted under Section 17 and determined under Section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003.

2. **DETAILS**

2.1 Application

The application is made by Tesco Stores Ltd of Tesco House, Delamare Road, Cheshunt, Hertfordshire EN8 9SL and relates to Tesco, 89-91 Guildford Road, Lightwater, Surrey, GU18 5SB

A Copy of the representations are also included and attached at Document 1.

The application is for the supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises only, and from 0600 to 2300hrs daily.

The provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshment are not included in the application.

2.2 **Grounds for the Hearing**

'Other Persons' contend that the carrying on of licensable activities at the premises could lead to the following licensing objectives being seriously undermined:

- i) The prevention of crime and disorder;
- ii) Protection of public safety;
- iii) Prevention of public nuisance;
- iv) Protection of children from harm;

We are a national retailer that sells alcohol as part of a broad offering of goods and services. We have held off-licences in our stores for many years and are an approved British Institute of Inn-keeping examination centre. We have written training policies and formal training programmes are in place, which ensure our people are equipped to meet all licensing objectives. All training and revision/refresher materials are reviewed regularly. All stores currently comply with our 'Think 25' policy, this is brought to customer's attention through point of sale material within the store. We take legal compliance very seriously and in addition to local training we employ a central alcohol licensing compliance manager and have a compliance committee.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises will have digital CCTV system that covers many areas of the shop floor, including the proposed area which will be used for beer and wine, should we be successful with our application.

Images will be retained for a minimum of 21 days and made available on enforcement request.

Ordinarily, a member of the Management team will be on the premises all the time the store is open. A person will have responsibility for the premises whilst the premises are open.

c) Public safety

A person will have responsibility for the premises whilst the premises are open. Management will be trained to support the running of the premises including looking after our customers and staff. The store will adhere to all rules and regulations relating to public safety.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

We intend to be an active member of the community. We welcome the opportunity to liaise with Police and enforcement authorities should the need arise.

e) The protection of children from harm

All staff will be trained and regularly refreshed in the corporate 'Think 25' Policy. Staff will be trained to look at the customer and 'Think 25' when selling alcohol.

A till prompt will appear on the initial sale of alcohol that will remind the seller of their responsibilities including not to sell alcohol to anyone under the age of 18.

The store will display signage around the premises informing both staff and customers of our 'Think 25' policy on alcohol.

Crime and disorder

The police have read the application and have noted that the condition relating to the CCTV is not adequate. The type of premises that are applying for this premises licence do suffer a great deal from offences of shoplifting and in almost all of the cases CCTV is very important to assist Police in tracing offenders. Camberley Police also carry out test purchase operations in the local area due to the intelligence received regarding underage drinking and fake identification cards that are in circulation. The Police believe that by imposing stricter conditions on checking identification cards and CCTV the crime and disorder issue would be greatly reduced. The Police recommend the following conditions for CCTV and identification cards

Prevention of crime and disorder

1) Appropriate digital CCTV equipment and a sufficient number of cameras shall be installed and maintained at the premises to record colour images that are clear enough to allow the Police to use them to investigate any crimes that are committed on the premises. The areas covered by the cameras will cover all areas within the premises that are open to the public

A camera will be positioned to obtain images of persons entering the building by the main entrance

2) No persons other than the Police, the licensing authority, the premise licensing holder the manager or authorised person shall have access to the CCTV recording equipment or the recordings made from such equipment. The CCTV system will be in operation and recording whenever the premises are open to the public.

3) Recordings made on the CCTV system shall be retained for a period of at least 30 days of recording

4) A minimum of 2 notices stating that CCTV is in operation shall be displayed throughout the premises where the public have access. The notices shall be at least A4 size


