This is my objection representation against the public planning notice in respect of 126 Frimley Road ....(previously Threshers).

I am concerned that with an additional licence premises making it 3 convenience stores selling alcohol in a very short length of the parade approx 150mtrs there will be an increased level of disturbance late in the evening should the licence be approved.

We do not need another convenience store in this area, which is also intended by the application.

It also has been noted recently, that Tescos have submitted an appeal against the refusal of them developing Pembroke house. With this in mind, if they are successful, then it would be 4 in this location encouraging more consumption of alcohol and increasing more footfall/noise etc along this short stretch of premises.

There are far too many alcohol drinking related premises in this location. It will be saturated with these types of facilities.

Of course, then there is the possibility of Krooner Park/Crabtree Park issue of being granted the re-delopment of the Football premise with longer hours, as it will then become a commercial development.

I am concerned of the potential behaviour of consumers able to obtain alcohol at any time every day till late evening and cause trouble by certain groups of the public.

I hope that the new occupiers, if granted, would compromise on their opening hours, by reducing the closing time, with the view of 'calming' down this area of any disturbances.

I live in Gordon Avenue, Camberley and was surprised to see the application for another licensed convenience store on the Frimley Road parade of shops. I feel that we are already well served by the existing shops and having another one seems excessive.

However my main concern is that licensing hours that have been applied for would allow people who have drunk heavily in the local area to buy more alcohol which they can then drink in the street as they return home. Limiting the licensing hours for the Grover Convenience Store would lessen this risk. The existing stores do not sell alcohol after 10 pm. With regards to the Premises licence application in respect of 126 Frimley Road, Camberley, Surrey GU15 2ON, we wish to object to the granting of liquor license for the following reasons.

- 1. The prevention of crime and disorder: Though the premises will be guarded by CCTV, we fear the alcohol will be drunk in the poorly lit side road Krooner Road. This will cause serious litter problem and possible vandalism of our premises. It is conceivable that youth may congregate on the corner of the premises and cause public disorder.
- 2. <u>Public Safety</u>: The Government's agenda for better public health with excessive alcohol consumption as one of the main concerns, it does not seem reasonable or in keeping with public health programme of reducing alcohol consumption that yet another outlet to offer more alcohol to public is safe.
- 3. <u>Prevention public nuisance</u>: There can be no doubt that inebriated individuals will cause public nuisance without any consideration to the residents of this area.
- 4. <u>Protection of children from harm</u>: Krooner Road is small residential road and majority of the houses are occupied by families with children. The sight of drunken individual whist the children are playing is harmful to safety of children and could encourage the children to think that this is a normal behaviour.

All the assurances by the applicant are really effective within their premises and there is clearly no assurance that neighbourhood will be afforded any protection in respect of the four required criteria. Though not of prime consideration, there are already sufficient outlets selling alcohol on off license and on license basis.

More of the same is not the way to revive secondary high streets. Consideration should be given to varied trades offering choice to the local community and avoiding the need for them to travel miles to obtain day to day living needs.
