SUMMARY

The report presents the application for a Review of a Premises Licence relating to Que Pasa, 21 High Street, Camberley, Surrey, GU15 3RB. The Premises has a licence at this time, that licence number being SHBCPR-05129. The Licensing authority is required to hold a hearing to determine this Review application.

The purpose of the hearing is for the Licensing Sub-Committee to consider the Review Application, in relation to the Licensing Act 2003's Licensing Objectives. The Licensing objectives being in this Review:

- 1 the prevention of crime and disorder
- 2 public safety
- 3 the prevention of public nuisance

Review Application

2.1 The Review application is made by Inspector Martin Goodwin for and on behalf of Surrey Police.

Grounds for the Review

Surrey Police contend that the carrying on of licensable activities at the premises has led to the following licensing objectives:

- i) The prevention of crime and disorder;
- ii) Protection of public safety;
- iii) Prevention of public nuisance;

Being seriously undermined.

Surrey Police have on-going concerns, particularly with regard to the failure by the management to control crime, disorder and nuisance.

The Police have attended the premises on number of occasions regarding crime and disorder issues. The incidents detailed in the application commence from the 6th November 2011.

Supply of alcohol is for consumption on the premises.

3. NEXT STEPS

The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives:

- To modify the conditions of the licence
- To exclude a licensable activity from the licence

- To remove the designated premises supervisor
- Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months
- To revoke the licence

The Sub-Committee is asked to note that it may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.

4. HOW THE PROPOSED COURSE OF ACTION WILL PROMOTE HUMAN RIGHTS AND EQUALITY

Human Rights and Equality issues will be taken into account on the determination of the Application by balancing the competing rights of the applicant, responsible authority and the interested party.

The imposition of conditions will be proportionate having regard to the competing rights referred to above and will only be imposed where necessary to achieve this aim.
