5/L Minutes

The minutes of the meeting held on 5 September were confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

6/L Gambling Act 2005 - Draft Statement of Principles 2019- 2022

The Committee was reminded that the Council, as a licensing authority, had a duty to undertake various regulatory functions imposed by the provisions of the Gambling Act 2005 and before exercising these functions it must first adopt a "Statement of Policy" indicating how the functions would be exercised. This Statement required review every 3 years from date of adoption.

At its meeting on 5 September 2018 the Committee had considered a draft revised Statement. The draft Statement had subsequently been subject to a 12 week public consultation, which had taken place between 01 October and 31 December 2018.

The Committee was informed that the draft statement of principles incorporated amendments brought about by the Gambling Commission's Guidance to licensing authorities, which was last published in September 2015.

Members expressed disappointment that there had been no consultation responses. The Committee were assured that despite the absence of responses, a comprehensive list of consultees, including Residents Associations had been written to as part of the consultation. In addition it was noted that there had been a set of themed social media posts on the consultation.

RECOMMENDED that the Gambling Act 2005 Statement of Policy – 31 January 2019 to 30 January 2022, as attached at Annex A to the agenda report, be adopted.

7/L Licensing Sub Committee Minutes

The Chairman signed the minutes of the Licensing Sub Committee meetings which had taken place since the previous meeting. In addition the minutes of the meeting of the Licensing Sub Committee held on 29 August were also signed, as they had not available for noting at the date of the last meeting.

The Committee was reminded that, in order to avoid the risk of the perception of bias or predetermination, it was considered bad practise for a Ward Member to be appointed to a Licensing Sub Committee to determine Licensing applications within his/her Ward.

8/L Licensing Act 2003 - Summary of Decisions

The Committee received details of the decisions taken under delegated powers in respect of licence applications where no representations had been received from the responsible authorities or any other persons.

**Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing –
Driver Medical Assessments**

Ward(s) Affected: All

Purpose

To consider a recommendation to require Hackney Carriages and Private Hire drivers to notify the Council of specific medical conditions which may affect their fitness to drive.

Background

1. The conditions and requirements relating to Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Drivers are regulated by the Council under the provisions of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 (The Act).

Current Position

1. Every district council which adopted The Act, in the mid-1970s, has had the right to set conditions and regulations relating to Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Drivers on the grounds of public safety.
2. One of the conditions set in Surrey Heath relates to a requirement that all licensed drivers undergo a medical examination upon application and then every 3 years subsequently, until the age of 65 and where examinations will take place annually.
3. There is presently no requirement for a licensed driver to notify the Council should they have a medical condition or undergo treatment between triennial medicals.

Driver Medicals

4. The Council has a responsibility to ensure that persons who are granted a licence to drive a Hackney Carriage or Private Hire Vehicle are 'fit and proper' under the provisions of Sections 51 and 53 of The Act and continue to remain so while licensed.
5. One part of this 'fit and proper' test relates to medical standards and the generally accepted practice nationwide is to adopt a similar standard to that used by the DVLA who require a 'Group 2' standard to be applied to every person who holds a lorry or bus licence.
6. This Council requires licensed drivers and new applicants to obtain a Group 2 medical from their own GP, which is then referred to the Council's Medical Advisor should anything untoward be revealed. The medical advisor would then make the decision to grant or refuse the application.
7. DVLA guidance makes it clear that a driver of any class of vehicle may be prosecuted and fined up to £1000 if they do not tell the DVLA about a medical condition which affects their driving and are involved in an accident as a result.
8. However, currently as per DVLA guidance, any action taken against a taxi driver would not have the Group 2 medical standard applied, only the lower Group 1

standard for any private car or motorcycle. There would be no regard as to whether the driver holds a hackney carriage or private hire licence issued by a local authority.

9. Officers recommend that driver conditions be amended to include a requirement that Hackney Carriage and Private Hire drivers shall notify the Council in writing should they develop a condition or receive treatment for a notifiable medical condition, as defined by the DVLA Group 2 standard, and as summarised in Annex A.
10. Such notification shall be as soon as is practicable and in any case before driving a licensed vehicle.

Legislation

11. The provisions of Section 51 and 53 of the Act provides that a licence shall be granted if satisfied that the applicant is 'fit and proper' to hold a licence. Section 61 provides powers to suspend, revoke or refuse to renew a driver's licence.

Recommendations

12. The Committee is advised to resolve that:
 - i. The proposed revisions to the conditions for Hackney Carriage and Private Hire drivers as set out in paragraph 9, above be adopted.

Medical standards for drivers of Hackney Carriage or Private Hire Vehicles for common medical conditions

1. It is the duty of you as the licence holder to inform us if you have a condition or are undergoing treatment or have a medical condition that may now, or in the future, affect your safety as a driver. You must inform us in writing and supply supporting medical reports/letters within 7 days of the start of the condition.
2. The standards are higher for Hackney Carriage and Private Hire drivers than those required for normal car drivers. This page is a list of common conditions that would bar someone from becoming a Hackney Carriage and or a Private Hire driver, it is not an exclusive list. If you are in any doubt as to whether your condition would affect your application please email the Licensing team at licensing@surreyheath.gov.uk for further advice.
3. The following conditions are a bar to holding a Hackney Carriage and or Private Hire driver licence:

3.1. Epileptic attack

Applicants must have been free of epileptic seizures for at least the last 10 years and have not taken anti-epileptic medication during this 10 year period. If these conditions cannot be met the Council may refuse or revoke the licence.

3.2. Diabetes

Insulin treated diabetics may not obtain a licence unless they held a Hackney Carriage and or Private Hire driver licence valid at 1 April 1991 and the Council had knowledge of the insulin treatment before 1 January 1991, or if they meet a strict criteria for diabetic control. If you believe you may meet these criteria please contact Licensing to discuss this further.

3.3. Eyesight

a) Applicants for Hackney Carriage and Private Hire vehicle driver licences must have

- i) A visual acuity of at least 6/7.5 (0.8 decimal) in the better eye; **and**
- ii) A visual acuity of at least 6/60 (0.1 decimal) in the other eye; **and**
- iii) Where glasses are worn to meet the minimum standards, they should have corrective power not exceeding +8 dioptries in any meridian of either lens.

b) It is also necessary for all drivers of Group 2 vehicles to be able to meet the prescribed and relevant Group 1 visual acuity requirements:-

- i) Must be able to meet the above prescribed standard for reading a number plate. In addition, the visual acuity (with the aid of glasses or contact lenses if worn) must be at least 6/12 (Snellen decimal 0.5) with both eyes open, or in the only eye if monocular.

c) Applicants are barred from holding a Hackney Carriage and or Private Hire vehicle driver licence if they have

- i) Uncontrolled diplopia (double vision)
- ii) Or do not have a normal binocular field of vision

4. Other medical conditions

In addition to those medical conditions shown above, applicants (or licence holders) should be shown as unfit to drive a Hackney Carriage and or Private Hire vehicle if they are unable to meet the DVLA Group 2 guidelines in the following cases:

- 4.1. Within 3 months of myocardial infraction, any episode of unstable angina, CABG or coronary angioplasty
- 4.2. A significant disturbance of cardiac rhythm unless special criteria are met
- 4.3. Suffering from or receiving medication for angina or heart failure
- 4.4. Hypertension where the BP is consistently 180 systolic or over or 100 diastolic or over
- 4.5. A stroke, or TIA within the last 12 months
- 4.6. Unexplained loss of consciousness within the past 5 years



- 4.7. Meniere's and other conditions causing disabling vertigo, within the past year and with a liability to recurrence
- 4.8. Recent severe head injury with serious continuing after effects, or major brain surgery
- 4.9. Parkinson's disease, multiple sclerosis or other "chronic" neurological disorders likely to affect limb power and coordination
- 4.10. Suffering from a psychotic illness in the past 3 years, or suffering from dementia
- 4.11. Persistent alcohol, drug or substance misuse in the past 12 months or alcohol, drug or substance misuse in the past 3 years
- 4.12. Insuperable difficulty in communicating by telephone in an emergency
- 4.13. Any other serious medical conditions which may cause problems for road safety
- 4.14. If major psychotropic or neuroleptic medication is being taken
- 4.15. Any malignant condition within the last 2 years likely to metastasise to the brain for example malignant melanoma

A Hackney Carriage or Private Hire driver licence issued after cardiac assessment – usually for ischaemic or untreated heart valve disease – will usually be short-term and licence renewal will require satisfactory medical reports including an exercise or other functional test, as required from the DVLA. Safeguarding Training for Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Drivers and Private Hire Operators

Ward(s) Affected:	All

Purpose

To consider a requirement for Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Drivers to receive compulsory Safeguarding Adults and Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) Training

1 Background

- 1.1 In recent years there has been greater awareness about the issue of Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE). High profile media coverage of specific cases in the North of England highlighted failures within social services and other public sector bodies. These failures often allowed the abuse of vulnerable children to continue without detection or action.
- 1.2 In the wake of such incidents and as a result of the attention that grooming and other forms of exploitation have received, the Government have put additional focus on combating CSE. On 10th September 2014, the Government appointed Louise Casey to carry out a Report of Inspection of Rotherham Borough Council specifically in relation to its functions on governance, children and young people, and taxi and private hire licensing. The Government responded to these reports in March 2015 with publication of the document Tackling Child Sexual Exploitation.
- 1.3 One area of concern identified within Louise Casey's Report of Inspection was whether Rotherham Borough Council had made sufficient efforts to ensure that only 'fit and proper' persons were permitted to hold a hackney carriage or private hire licence. Professor Jay described the prominent role of taxi drivers in facilitating or engaging in CSE as a 'common thread' across England, while inspectors have raised concerns that the licensing and enforcement side of taxi and private hire regulation are often unable or uninterested in getting to grips with the issue and using their powers to good effect.
- 1.4 Those with a responsibility for confronting and tackling CSE therefore need to be aware of the potential role that taxis can play in facilitating abuse, ensure that only those who are fit and proper hold a licence, and that there are robust procedures in place for dealing with complaints. Public safety must be the first and most important priorities when determining policy, setting standards and determining enforcement of issues related to taxi and private hire licensing.
- 1.5 It is also important that those with responsibility for overseeing the taxi and private hire licensing functions of local authorities are aware of the challenges that those operating within the trade may face when asked to transport children or vulnerable adults. Taxi drivers fall under the scope of Section 59(A) of the Sexual Offences Act 2003, which makes it an offence to intentionally arrange or facilitate the travel of a person within the UK for the purposes of sexual exploitation; or believes that another person is likely to abuse the passenger during or after the journey. This means that if a driver transports a child knowing or believing that the child will be sexually exploited, that driver will commit the offence of human trafficking and could face a maximum sentence of 14 years imprisonment.
- 1.6 There is a responsibility, on local authorities, private hire operators, and individual drivers to ensure that licensed drivers are aware of the warning signs that could indicate when a passenger is at risk of trafficking or CSE, and that training is available or has been undertaken to assist those in the taxi trade to deal with such scenarios and report them to the relevant authorities.
- 1.7 Part of the Surrey Multi-Agency Strategic Child Exploitation action plan, has been to agree consistent procedures with district and borough councils for vetting and licensing of premises and taxis and agree standards for revoking licenses.
- 1.8 Partnership working between all Surrey District, Borough, and County Councils agreed a consistent approach across the county to provide specific safeguarding CSE training. This was initially delivered by Surrey Police in the form of a presentation. An interactive online system was then developed with the Barnardos organisation which included a wider range of safeguarding subjects, including vulnerable adults

2 Training

- 2.1 On 21 July 2015 all licensed Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Drivers/Operators were invited to attend a safeguarding course delivered by Surrey Police. Of the approximate 230 licensees, just 8 attended the one day training course.
- 2.2 The process was repeated but with more forceful wording on 28 February 2017 and 77 drivers attended the training session, 9 drivers have made arrangements to receive training with other Boroughs on alternative dates and a further 36 drivers have received training provided by their operators as a result of a compulsory requirement for Surrey County Council School Contracts, making a total of 122 or 53% of licensed drivers.
- 2.3 In June 2018, the Barnardos online training package was rolled out across the County. All previously untrained drivers were offered online safeguarding training upon the supply of a valid e-mail address. 54 Surrey Heath licensed drivers have passed the course and provided with a safeguarding certificate

3 Current Position

- 3.1 Existing drivers have had the opportunity to receive free CSE training for nearly 4 years, with free on-line training being available for the last 12 months.
- 3.2 Officers propose mandatory CSE training for all licensed Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Drivers and Operators in order to promote public safety and ensure that such persons remain 'fit and proper' to fulfil their role.
- 3.3 It is also recommended that all new applicants undertake appropriate CSE training as part of the application process, and that this is a mandatory requirement for all new and existing drivers to be fulfilled by 31 October 2019.

4 Resource Implications

- 4.1 The only additional resource implication arising from the training process is postage and stationary costs. The total costs are met within the existing budget. It is proposed that future training will be self-funded.

5 Recommendations

- 5.1 That the Licensing Committee resolve that:
 - i. all persons who make an application to renew or be granted a Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Drivers licence must first receive compulsory safeguarding training, as defined by the Executive Head of Community, regarding Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) with immediate effect and for licence conditions to be amended accordingly.
 - ii. any existing Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Drivers who have not received safeguarding training, as defined by the Executive Head of Community, regarding Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) by 31 October 2019 shall have their licence suspended or revoked.

- the Licence Holder; together with reference to the Licensing Objectives: Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Protection of Children from Harm, the Council's own Licensing Policy and the Secretary of State's guidance.

The Sub Committee noted that no additional representations had been received from any of the Responsible Bodies or any other persons.

The Sub Committee noted the concerns raised by Surrey Police in their application including:

Crime and Disorder/Protection of Children from Harm

- The CCTV system was not operational at the time of the reported robbery.
- The Designated Premises Supervisor had been unaware of the reported robbery when the Police Licensing Officer contacted him two days after the event.
- Staff at the premises maintained that they had received no training in relation to licensable matters despite having worked at the premises for a number of months.
- The Designated Premises Supervisor appeared to be unaware of the conditions of the Premises Licence when the Police questioned him about them.
- There were no entries in the Sales Refusal Log Book.

The Sub-Committee also took note of the fact that;

- Ensuring that staff training on the Licencing Act 2003 occurred regularly was a condition of the Premises Licence. The apparent failure to train staff who had been in employment at the premises for a number of months was a clear breach of this licence condition.
- Ensuring that the premises had CCTV that was maintained in good working order and fully operational at all times when the premises were open was a condition of the Premises Licence. In failing to ensure that the CCTV was working on the day of the reported robbery the licence holder had breached the licence conditions.
- Those working at the premises knew the majority of their customers and had not had reason to question a customer's age. It was confirmed that no test purchases had been carried out on the premises since the Licence had been granted.

In reaching their decision, the Sub Committee took into consideration the representations made in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder. The Sub-Committee acknowledged the Licence Holder's admission that appropriate procedures had not been place in relation to staff training and CCTV maintenance and that steps had been taken to rectify the situation. The offer to replace the Designated Premises Supervisor and ensure that the Designated Premises Supervisor was present at all times in the future was also noted.

However, it was considered that the concerns raised in the application clearly breached the conditions placed on the Premises Licence and that this in turn undermined the relevant licensing objectives. From the representations made, the Sub Committee lacked confidence that the Licence Holder would trade as a responsible body.

The decision making process was a matter of judgement by the Sub Committee and having weighed all the evidence provided by Surrey Police, as the applicant, and the Licence Holder the evidence came down clearly in favour of revoking the licence. The Sub Committee considered that the Licence Holder had failed from the outset to sufficiently consider the processes and policies required to ensure that the four licensing objectives were being promoted adequately.

On balance, the Sub Committee decided that not revoking the Premises Licence, would have an adverse impact on the promotion of the four licensing objectives: Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance, and Protection of Children from Harm and found no justification to follow any other course of action.

RESOLVED that the Premises Licence held in respect of Bargain Beer and Wines, 126 Frimley Road, Camberley, GU15 2QN be revoked.
