THE PROCEDURE FOR HEARINGS OF THE LICENSING PANEL

ORDER OF THE HEARING

Licensing Sub-Committee hearings shall be conducted as follows:

- 1) A Chairman will be elected for the duration of the Sub-Committee hearing.
- 2) The Chairman will open the proceedings by stating the nature of the matter which is to be considered and will welcome the parties, introduce them and confirm the roles of those present.
- 3) The Chairman shall first call upon the Licensing Authority's representative to put forward their case. This will include confirmation of whether or not the formal requirements in respect of the matter to be considered have been complied with.
- 4) If satisfied as to the formal requirements, the Sub-Committee will consider the merits of the application or proposed suspension/revocation and the report of the officer. The Panel may ask the Licensing Authority's representative for clarification of any points.
- 5) The applicant shall have an opportunity to put questions to the Licensing Authority's representative.
- 6) The Chairman will then invite (if any) Responsible Bodies who have made representations to speak. The Sub-Committee may ask Responsible Bodies interested parties questions and points of clarification.
- 7) The Chairman will then invite (if any) interested parties who have made representations to speak. The Sub-Committee may ask interested parties questions and points of clarification.
- 8) The Chairman will then invite the applicant or licence holder to make any representations.
- 9) The Chairman, members of the Sub-Committee and the Licensing Authority's representative may ask the applicant questions and points of clarification. Having heard the applicant's statement, any Responsible Authorities in attendance will be given the opportunity to respond.
- 10) An opportunity shall be given to the Licensing Authority's representative and the applicant, in that order, to sum up their case (but not to add any new facts).
- 11) The Sub-Committee members, the representative from Legal Services and Clerk to the Sub-Committee shall withdraw. Officers present do not take part in the decision making but will provide legal and procedural advice and record the decision.
- 12) The members of the Sub-Committee consider their decision. The applicant or his/her representative (if any) and any officer present is asked to remain in attendance and if any further clarification or information is required from the applicant or licence holder or any officer, this will be sought by the clerk.
- 13) The decision of the Sub-Committee shall be notified to the applicant and her/his representative (if any) within five working days following the meeting. In most cases, a verbal decision will be given on the day of the hearing.

ROLES OF THOSE AT THE HEARING

- 1) The Licensing Authority's representative is present at the hearing to present the professional officer's case for refusal, suspension or revocation of licences. They are also present to challenge points put forward by the applicant.
- 2) Members of the Sub-Committee are present to consider and determine an application or to consider if a licence should be suspended or revoked. In doing so they will follow the above procedure.
- 3) The Reserve Committee Member will be present throughout the hearing up until the Sub-Committee retires to deliberate the application in private. The Reserve member will not take part in either the public discussions or the private deliberations unless they are required to substitute for one of the Sub-Committee members for any reason.
- 4) The Legal representative is present to provide legal advice to the members of the Sub-Committee and to assist in the clarification of any issues which might arise.
- 5) The representative from Democratic Services is present to provide procedural advice to members of the Sub-Committee and to record the decision.

1. SUMMARY

- 1.1 The report presents the application for a variation to a Premises Licence relating to Mytchett SF Connect, 150 Mytchett Road, Mytchett, Camberley, Surrey, GU16 6AE. A copy of the current premises licence is attached as Annex 1.
- 1.2 The Licensing Authority is required to hold a hearing to determine this premises licence application because relevant representations have been received.
- 1.3 The purpose of the hearing is for the Licensing Sub-Committee to consider the Application, in relation to the Licensing Act 2003's Licensing Objectives. The Licensing objectives being in this Application:
 - i. The prevention of crime and disorder
 - ii. Public safety
 - iii. The prevention of public nuisance
 - iv. The protection of children from harm
- 1.4 Copies of the application, relevant representations and other correspondence received to date are attached to this report.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 The Sub-Committee is recommended to determine the premises licence application.

4. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report

- 4.1 For the Sub-Committee to determine the application for a Premises Licence in respect of Mytchett SF Connect, 150 Mytchett Road, Mytchett, Camberley, Surrey, GU16 6AE. The application is submitted under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Background of the premises

Statutory background

- 4.2 The Licensing Act 2003 and secondary legislation in the form of Regulations there under.

Relevant Government policy

- 4.3 Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. (effective from April 2018)

Relevant Council policy

- 4.4 Statement of Licensing Policy.

DETAILS

Application

- 4.5 The application is made by Winckworth Sherwood LLP on behalf of BP Oil UK Limited Chertsey Road, Sunbury on Thames, Middlesex TW16 7BP and relates to premises at Mytchett SF Connect, 150 Mytchett Road, Mytchett, Camberley, Surrey, GU16 6AE.
- 4.6 The application is to permit the supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises only, and therefore does not include reference to regulated entertainment or the provision of late night refreshment.
The application is attached as Annex 2.

Grounds for the Hearing

- 4.7 Surrey Police and an Interested Party in their capacity as 'Other Persons' contend that the carrying on of licensable activities at the premises could lead to one or more of the following licensing objectives being seriously undermined:
- i. The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - ii. Protection of public safety;
 - iii. Prevention of public nuisance;
 - iv. Protection of children from harm;

Further evidence submitted regarding the Application

- 4.8 Details included in documents attached to this report.

Responsible Authority Representations/ Comments

- 4.9 A representation has been received from Surrey Police and this is attached as Annex 3.
- 4.10 No representations were received from the Fire and Rescue Service, the Local Planning Authority, Environmental Health, Child Protection Agencies or the Health and Safety Executive.

- 4.11 representation has been received from three 'Other Persons.' Copies of the representations are attached as Annex 4. The representations are relevant to the 'Prevention of crime and disorder', the 'Protection of public safety' and 'Prevention of public nuisance' licensing objectives.
- 4.12 The application was submitted on 10 May 2019. The application was completed correctly and advertised as required by the Licensing Act 2003.

Policy Considerations

- 4.12 Details of relevant policy considerations, including local policy statement:

Paragraphs 1 – 89, 95 – 138 of the Council's Licensing Policy Statement are applicable to the consideration of this application.

5. NEXT STEPS

- 5.1 The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives.
- 5.2 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also required to have regard to Guidance issued under Section 182 Licensing Act 2003, as amended, and the Council's own Licensing Policy.
- 5.3 The Sub-Committee must have regard to all the representations made and the evidence it hears.
- 5.4 The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives:
- To grant the licence subject to conditions
 - To exclude a licensable activity to which the application relates
 - To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor.
 - To reject the application
- 5.5 The Sub-Committee is asked to note that it may not add conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.

6. HOW THE PROPOSED COURSE OF ACTION WILL PROMOTE HUMAN RIGHTS AND EQUALITY

- 6.1 Human Rights and Equality issues will be taken into account on the determination of the Application by balancing the competing rights of the applicant, responsible authority and the interested party.
- 6.2 The imposition of conditions will be proportionate having regard to the competing rights referred to above and will only be imposed where necessary to achieve this aim.

Mandatory conditions

S19

i) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

ii) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

S19A

Age Verification

4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

Alcohol minimum permitted price

6.

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

No alcohol shall be sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

1. A digital CCTV system will be installed, or the existing system maintained, such system to be fit for purpose.
2. The CCTV system shall be capable of producing immediate copies on site. Copies of recordings will either be recorded digitally on to CD/DVD or other equivalent medium.
3. Any recording will be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 31 days and shall be made available, subject to compliance with Data Protection legislation, to the police for inspection on request.
4. The precise positions of the cameras may be agreed, subject to compliance with Data Protection legislation, with the police from time to time.
5. The system will display, on any recording, the correct time and date of the recording.
6. The CCTV system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity.

Public Safety

7. The premises licence holder will at all times maintain adequate levels of staff. Such staff levels will be disclosed, on request, to the licensing authority and police.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

8. Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers shall be provided in and immediately outside the premises.

Protection of Children from Harm

9. The premises licence holder will ensure that an age verification policy will apply to the premises whereby all cashiers will be trained to ask any customer attempting to purchase alcohol, who appears to be under the age of 25 years (or older if the licence holder so elects) to produce, before being sold alcohol, identification being a passport or photocard driving licence bearing a holographic mark or other form of identification that complies with any mandatory condition that may apply to this licence.

Conditions attached following a Hearing on 19 November 2018


1. The hours for the sale of alcohol shall revert to 0800hrs - 2300hrs on 19/07/2019
2. If there is only one member of staff on duty between 0000 and 0500, the entrance door to the shop will be closed to customers and any sales between these hours will be made through the night pay window.
3. Where there is more than one member of staff on duty between the hours of 0000 and 0500, a remote door lock facility will be in use for all admissions of customers entering the premises and all customers entering the premises will be monitored.







This is the 2nd application that has been received by Surrey Police regarding BP requesting a 24 hour alcohol licence for the BP garage situated at 150 Mytchett Road Mytchett Camberley

The garage is still one of the premises that is causing concern to the Surrey Heath Police neighbourhood team due to the high level of crime that occurs on a regular basis from the garage.

The first hearing was on the 19th November 2018 and the licensing committee's decision was to grant a temporary licence for 8 months with 2 conditions, the full committee's decision is attached to this representation.

At present the garage is using the temporary licence granted by the licensing committee and can sell alcohol 24 hours daily.

The application before the committee today shows that there is still a high level of crime from the garage and there has been no reduction in the crime at the premises since the committee hearing on the 19th November 2018.

Evidence before the Sub-Committee

Representations have been received from one ‘Other Persons’, namely Mr K Clarke. Mr Clarke was not present at the hearing and his concerns were formally noted and recorded. He did submit a Regulation 8 Notice to this effect. This representation has been accepted by the Committee as read.

Oral representations were made by Mr. Botkai on behalf of the Applicant. The Application was amended to vary the licence on a temporary basis and to include proposals for two conditions to be attached.

Mr. Botkai offered a temporary variation to the licence was proposed for an 8 month period to be subject to a review from 6 months and that an Application for permanent variation of the licence would potentially follow a successful review. Mr. Botkai highlighted that if there was a spike in crime with the new temporary variation to the licence that BP would wish to revert to the original licence conditions as it is a responsible retailer and would not wish to suffer reputational damage. Mr. Botkai stated that BP Connect will robustly promote the four licensing objectives. Mr. Botkai concluded his presentation by requesting the licence be granted or for a temporary grant to be considered with the conditions that should there be a single man on duty the doors must remain closed with a pay window during the extended licencing hours and that if the premises was manned

by two staff, the door was to be opened only if the staff were content during the hours of 0000-0500hrs.

Councillor Ilnicki asked Mr. Botkai to clarify what monetary value constitutes a reportable theft.

Mr. Botkai responded that there was a threshold for reportable theft but this is not public information it is a police matter; however it was not the only concern of BP who did want to see actual crimes reduced, not just statistics.

Councillor Pitt requested to know how the theft of alcohol was tracked as in the time and item that was taken.

Mr. Botkai responded that a member of staff has reported the theft, the time of the occurrence and the value of the theft.

Councillor Pitt requested to know if there was a link to MOWP and theft.

Mr. Botkai did not know any correlation here as the MWOP often do not enter the building.

The Decision

The Licensing Act encourages us to view our powers and responsibilities in the light of the community as a whole. The regime under the Act has a light touch approach to regulation and we carry out functions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, having regard to the statutory guidance and to the Statement of Licensing Policy.

If the sub-committee is minded to attach any conditions to the proposed temporary licence, these must be appropriate to promote one or more licensing objectives. They must be proportionate in that they are tailored to the activities taking place, the size, location, type and characteristics of the business and do not repeat those which duplicate other statutory provisions.

We will consider the licensing objectives in the following order:

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

We note the concerns of the 'Responsible Authority' regarding crime and disorder but the Committee are satisfied that no evidence has been provided that this objective will be undermined. The Committee feel that the conditions proposed by the Applicant in the Operating Schedule are adequate to address any concerns and will be enforceable by BP Connect. We are also mindful that any Licence granted can be reviewed under the Act.

The Protection of children from harm

We have had regard to the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy which states that the Council will have particular regard to the safety of children when considering licence applications. It is a mandatory condition that all premises must have an age verification policy. The existing measures that the applicant operates are more than satisfactory to meet the requirements of the Statement of Licensing Policy and legislation in the Committees opinion.

Public Safety

There is no evidence before us upon which we can consider that this objective is not likely to be promoted.

Prevention of public nuisance

No objection was raised by Environmental Health as a statutory responsible authority with regards to public nuisance. Whilst the written concerns of 'other persons' have been noted, there is no evidence before us that the premises will create the circumstances to which they refer to.

We therefore grant the Licence subject to the following conditions:

Conditions

We have had regard to whether conditions are appropriate in accordance with the guidance and the licensing policy and note those offered by the Applicant in the operating schedule. In summary, we find it is appropriate to grant the temporary variation to the licence for a period of 8 months, with two conditions attached being:

- 1 If there is only one member of staff on duty between 0000 and 0500, the entrance door to the shop will be closed to customers and any sales between these hours will be made through the night pay window.
- 2 Where there is more than one member of staff on duty between the hours of 0000 and 0500, a remote door lock facility will be in use for all admissions of customers entering the premises and all customers entering the premises will be monitored.

These conditions are consistent with the proposed operating schedule, the wording to be determined by the Licensing Officer and Chairman of the Committee and to be provided to the Applicant within 5 working days.

I wish to object to the above application to allow the 24 hour sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises for the following reasons.

It is widely known and accepted that drink-driving is abhorrent, and totally unacceptable in our society. Unfortunately many victims of accidents involving drivers who drink are killed, and their relatives and friends suffer the loss for many years.

Previous governments have cracked down on drink driving for obvious reasons and this application flies in the face of cutting down on drink driving by virtually encouraging motorists who run out of alcohol at home to drive to a petrol station to replenish their stock. This to me, and I have personally dealt with the aftermath of accidents involving drivers who are over the limit, this application is totally unnecessary and will only exacerbate the problem of drink driving.

There are many other shops etc in the area where alcohol is sold, and the last thing the area needs is for garages to add to that list with an easy 24 hour availability of supply.

In 2015 there were 200 killed and 8270 injured in drink related accidents. In the following year the figures were 230 and 8800.
