THE PROCEDURE FOR HEARINGS OF THE LICENSING PANEL

ORDER OF THE HEARING

Licensing Sub-Committee hearings shall be conducted as follows:

- 1) A Chairman will be elected for the duration of the Sub-Committee hearing.
- 2) The Chairman will open the proceedings by stating the nature of the matter which is to be considered and will welcome the parties, introduce them and confirm the roles of those present.
- 3) The Chairman shall first call upon the Licensing Authority's representative to put forward their case. This will include confirmation of whether or not the formal requirements in respect of the matter to be considered have been complied with.
- 4) If satisfied as to the formal requirements, the Sub-Committee will consider the merits of the application or proposed suspension/revocation and the report of the officer. The Panel may ask the Licensing Authority's representative for clarification of any points.
- 5) The applicant shall have an opportunity to put questions to the Licensing Authority's representative.
- 6) The Chairman will then invite (if any) Responsible Bodies who have made representations to speak. The Sub-Committee may ask Responsible Bodies interested parties questions and points of clarification.
- 7) The Chairman will then invite (if any) interested parties who have made representations to speak. The Sub-Committee may ask interested parties questions and points of clarification.
- 8) The Chairman will then invite the applicant or licence holder to make any representations.
- 9) The Chairman, members of the Sub-Committee and the Licensing Authority's representative may ask the applicant questions and points of clarification. Having heard the applicant's statement, any Responsible Authorities in attendance will be given the opportunity to respond.
- 10) An opportunity shall be given to the Licensing Authority's representative and the applicant, in that order, to sum up their case (but not to add any new facts).
- 11) The Sub-Committee members, the representative from Legal Services and Clerk to the Sub-Committee shall withdraw. Officers present do not take part in the decision making but will provide legal and procedural advice and record the decision.
- 12) The members of the Sub-Committee consider their decision. The applicant or his/her representative (if any) and any officer present is asked to remain in attendance and if any further clarification or information is required from the applicant or licence holder or any officer, this will be sought by the clerk.
- 13) The decision of the Sub-Committee shall be notified to the applicant and her/his representative (if any) within five working days following the meeting. In most cases, a verbal decision will be given on the day of the hearing.

ROLES OF THOSE AT THE HEARING

- 1) The Licensing Authority's representative is present at the hearing to present the professional officer's case for refusal, suspension or revocation of licences. They are also present to challenge points put forward by the applicant.
- Members of the Sub-Committee are present to consider and determine an application or to consider if a licence should be suspended or revoked. In doing so they will follow the above procedure.
- 3) The Reserve Committee Member will be present throughout the hearing up until the Sub-Committee retires to deliberate the application in private. The Reserve member will not take part in either the public discussions or the private deliberations unless they are required to substitute for one of the Sub-Committee members for any reason.
- 4) The Legal representative is present to provide legal advice to the members of the Sub-Committee and to assist in the clarification of any issues which might arise.
- 5) The representative from Democratic Services is present to provide procedural advice to members of the Sub-Committee and to record the decision.

Report Title	Application for a variation to a Premises Licence at Lavershot Barns, London Road, Windlesham GU20 6LL application made by Michelle Hazelwood of the John Gaunt Partnership as agent for The Wooldridge Partnership.
Recommendation(s)	The Sub-committee determines the application for a variation to the premises licence in respect of at Lavershot Barns, London Road, Windlesham GU20 6LL

1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

- 1.1. This application dated 4 March 2021 is for a variation of a premises licence under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 (the 'Act'). A copy of the application and plans of the premises are attached at Annex A.
- 1.2. The existing premises licence has been in place since 27 February 2020. Presently the site consists of two licensable areas; Season Farm Shop and Seasons Restaurant.
- 1.3. A copy of the current premises licence and plan is attached at Annex B
- 1.4. Representations from local residents and Councillors are attached at Annex C.
- 1.5. A map showing the location of the premises is shown at Annex D.

2. **REPORT**

- 2.1. The application seeks permission for a new outside dining area to be known as Seasons Garden for the retail sale of alcohol for consumption 'on' and 'off' the premises and live and recorded music inside and outside Monday to Saturday 09:00 to 21:00 and Sunday 09:00 to 17:00.
- 2.2. The variation application also requests that the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol be extended to 23:00 on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday for Seasons Restaurant and permission is sought for live and recorded music outside also to cease at 23:00.
- 2.3. The current authorisation for opening hours is as follows:-
 - 07:30-16:00 Sunday
 - 07:30-18:00 Monday Tuesday Wednesday
 - 07:30-23:30 Thursday Friday Saturday
- 2.4. The early opening hour of the premises 07:30 is to provide hot food and drink (breakfast, tea, coffee etc.). The sale of hot food and drink is not a licensable activity unless it occurs between 23:00 and 05:00, between these times Late Night Refreshment must be authorised.
- 2.5. The authorised opening and closing hours on a premises licence are there to control licensable activities and the impact of licensable activities on the licensing objectives.

- 2.6. The current authorisation for the sale of alcohol from the premises is for 'on' and 'off' sales as follows:-
 - 09:00-15:30 Sunday
 - 09:00-17:30 Monday Tuesday Wednesday
 - 09:00-23:00 Thursday Friday Saturday
- 2.7. The current authorisation for late night refreshment indoors is as follows:-
 - 23:00-00:00 Thursday Friday Saturday
- 2.8. Additional late night refreshment permission has not been requested for Sunday, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.
- 2.9. The current authorisation for live and recorded music is restricted to indoors only, this is as follows:-
 - 09:00-15:30 Sunday
 - 09:00-17:30 Monday Tuesday Wednesday
 - 09:00-23:00 Thursday Friday Saturday
- 2.10. Members are reminded of the changes to music licensing that took place in 2015 following the Live Music Act 2012 and The Legislative Reform (Entertainment Licensing) Order 2014 which amended the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.11. This had the effect of deregulating live and recorded music at premises within the following circumstances:
 - i. <u>Live music</u>: no licence is required for:
 - ii. a performance of unamplified live music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, on any premises.
 - iii. a performance of amplified live music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - iv. <u>Recorded music</u>: no licence is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

3. PROMOTION OF LICENSING OBJECTIVES

3.1. No additional conditions are proposed.

4. REPRESENTATION – RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES

4.1. No representations have been received from responsible authorities. An email from the Planning Officer is included for information Annex E

5. REPRESENTATION – OTHER PERSONS

- 5.1. Three representations have been received, from local residents and a local Councillor and relate the licensing objective of the Prevention of Public Nuisance. These representations are attached at Annex C.
- 5.2. The applicant's agent has been served with the required notices and given copies of all representations.

6. POLICY CONSIDERATION

- 6.1. Surrey Heath Borough Council Statement of Licensing Policy, adopted 7 April 2021 is relevant considering this application.
- 6.2. The relevant paragraphs 6. Fundamental Principles, 13.Licensing Hours and 14. Promoting the Four Licensing Objectives.
- 7. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 7.1. An authority must carry out its functions under the Licensing Act 2003 with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder
 - Public safety
 - The prevention of public nuisance
 - The protection of children from harm,
- 7.2. In addition to the terms of the statute, the Sub-committee must have regard to its published licensing statement (Statement of Licensing Policy and Guidance) and guidance issued by the Secretary of State, under section 182.
- 7.3. The applicant, licence holder and any responsible authorities or other persons who have made representation have the right of appeal to a Magistrate's Court (within 21 days starting the day after the date of the decision notice) should they feel any decision is unjust. There is a possibility costs may be awarded against the Council where decisions are overturned.
- 8. HOW THE PROPOSED COURSE OF ACTION WILL PROMOTE HUMAN RIGHTS AND EQUALITY
 - **8.1.** Human Rights and Equality issues will be taken into account on the determination of the application by balancing the competing rights of the applicant, responsible authority and the interested party.
 - **8.2.** The imposition of conditions will be proportionate having regard to the competing rights referred to above and will only be imposed where necessary to achieve this aim.

i) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

ii) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

S19A

1. Irresponsible Promotions

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) (contents removed in 2014 order)

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

3. Potable Water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

4. Age Verification

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

5. Measures

The responsible person must ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcohol drinks are sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcohol drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint

(ii) gin, rum vodka or whiskey: 25ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

6. Alcohol minimum permitted price

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-

(a)"duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

 $P = D+(D \times V)$

where-

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

No alcohol shall be sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

1. Any person who shows signs of intoxication will be refused entry to the licensed premises.

2. Digital CCTV equipment shall be installed and maintained at the premises to record colour images that are clear enough to allow the Police to use them to investigate any crimes that are committed on the premises. A camera will be positioned to obtain images of persons entering the building by the main entrance.

3. The CCTV system shall be in operation and recording at all times whilst the premises are open to the public for licensable activities.

4. Recordings made on the CCTV system shall be retained for a period of at least 31 days of recording.

5. If the Police are called to the premises to deal with an incident the officers shall have access to view the CCTV footage on request. There shall be a member of staff on duty at all times who has knowledge of how the CCTV system works. If the CCTV footage cannot be downloaded for the Police when requested then it must be available within 24 hours of the request

6. All staff shall receive suitable training including refresher training every 6 months in relation to the Challenge 25 proof of age policy which shall be applied to the premises. A record of all training shall be maintained and signed by the person completing the training. The DPS or a personal licence holder who is employed at the premises will countersign the training record.

7. An incident book shall be kept on the premises and all incidents at the premises shall be recorded. The incident book shall be checked by the DPS or a personal licence holder employed at the premises every week, the incident book will then be signed and dated after the last entry.

8. A minimum of 2 notices stating that CCTV is in operation shall be displayed throughout the premises where the public have access. The notices shall be at A4 size Public Safety

9. The staff will not serve alcoholic beverages under any circumstances to any person who appears to be intoxicated or under the influence of drugs.

10. An appropriate first aid kit will be located in the premises and available for customers. Prevention of a Public Nuisance

11. Notices shall be displayed at the premises alerting people to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner.

12. The management fully understand that it is their duty to prevent their premises causing any nuisance to local residents or businesses and will monitor the external premises area in relation to any anti-social behaviour or public nuisance.

The Protection of Children from Harm

13. Only children accompanied by an adult will be permitted entry to the licensed premises and will be supervised by an adult at all times.

14. All staff shall receive suitable training including refresher training every 6 months in relation to the Challenge 25 proof of age policy which shall be applied to the premises

15. A refusals book shall be kept at the premises and a record kept of all persons who are refused the sale of alcohol. This book shall be made available on request to the police or authorised persons.

16. The premises will only accept valid forms of identification such as photo driving licence, passport and Home Office approved ID cards displaying the national proof of age standard scheme (PASS hologram). All customers who look under the age of 25 shall be challenged to prove their age and identity when purchasing alcohol.

I just wanted to start by saying thank you for all your time last Friday. Please see below all points raised, discussed and resolved at our meeting :

As discussed at the meeting on Friday 7th February 2020 :

• We walked into footprint of the restaurant area, where we indicated where the kitchen, toilets, private dining room and entrance would be located. The restaurant is half covered by a solid roof and half will be glass (windows will lift slightly to assist with air circulation). Both of these sections will cover the seating area for the restaurant.

- The entrance to the restaurant during the daytime operation will be via the walkway past Maidenhead Aquatics. During the evening operation, the exit will be via the garden centre (blocking off the daytime entrance). This will direct our guests to the back end of the property towards their vehicles. This was discussed with Jane Cresswell, Debbie Blackwell and Cllr Helen Hansen Hjal who all agreed this was a valid suggestion by Charlie Wooldridge.
- The opening times for the restaurant were discussed as the following :
 - Monday to Wednesday 9am to 6pm. Last orders for alcohol 5.30pm.
 - Thursday to Saturday 9am to 11pm. Last orders for alcohol 10.30pm.
 - Sunday 9am to 4pm. Last alcohol orders 3.30pm.
 - In our discussion with Jane and Debbie, we suggested that we would be willing to block off main entrance & exit for the restaurant from 6pm onwards. I raise the following objections in relation to the application above and hope that this will be moved to be considered by committee.

The revised opening hours which are sufficiently different that they can not, in my opinion be considered as a minor variation to the existing licensing application.

The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises are situated within a green belt setting with little in the way of street lighting outside the premises, with assertions from the applicant that lighting will not impede on neighbours ability to enjoy their premises and given that there is a main A30 access to the premises the rural, unpolished nature of the location may lead to an issue with anti social behaviour, increased vulnerability to diners returning to their cars and attract criminal activity 'on the off chance'.

The applicant/ business owner has not shown a great regard for respecting the law with regard to alcohol and has previous conviction for alcohol related offences.

Public Safety

A number of matters were raised at the previous application that related to public safety. Matters relating to fire safety, electrical circuitry, lighting, building safety or capacity, and first aid were considered to be relevant for further consideration when the planning application was heard. However, the planning application has not been heard and therefore public safety, particularly in relation to lighting and building safety has not been adequately considered and I am concerned that the access points, external capacity etc is insufficient in an 'out of town' facility. In particular the car parking areas, their lighting access etc..

Prevention of public nuisance.
