Surrey Police are objecting to the variation application on the grounds of crime and disorder

The BP Garage situated at 40 London Road Bagshot is one of the premises that is causing concern to the Surrey Heath Police neighbourhood team due to the high level of crime relating to amount of thefts (shoplifting) that occur on a regular basis from the shop and the large amount of drive offs without paying for petrol.

From the 26<sup>th</sup> February 2017 to the 4<sup>th</sup> September 2018 there have been 135 crimes recorded at the garage and when looking at the type of crime the results are as follows

Make off without paying for petrol 57 offences Miscellaneous thefts (shoplifting goods) 64 offences Thefts of alcohol 14 Total crimes recorded 135 (see crime figures attached)

At present the garage can sell alcohol from 08:00 hours to 23:00 hours daily. After 23:00 hours the alcohol is covered and out of view of customers as it is not for sale.

The application before the committee today shows that BP want to extend the licensing hours to 24 hours a day, the Police are very concerned that by having the alcohol on view and for sale for 24 hours will increase the already concerning level of crime at the garage

At 11:30 hours on Wednesday the 5<sup>th</sup> September 2018 The Police had a meeting with BP solicitor Mr Robert Botkai and the area manager for the BP Garage Mr Ranjit Kataria to discuss the application. Please see attached minutes.

The Police suggested that the applicant withdraw their application and put measures in place at the garage to try and reduce the amount of crime. Another meeting could then be arranged in about 3 months time to see if there has been an improvement in the crime statistics and the application could be discussed again

It would appear that the applicant wishes to go ahead with the application therefore the Police strongly wish to object to the application on the grounds of crime and disorder as they believe that by allowing the premises to sell alcohol for 24 hours will increase the already concerning amount of crime that is already occurring at the garage

## Licensing Meeting with BP garage Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> September 2018 Surrey Heath Borough Council

#### Present:-

Ranjit Kataria – Area Manager

Robert Botkai - solicitor

Rab Carnie - Surrey Police Licensing Officer

Sam Turner - Surrey Police Neighbourhood Sergeant

Derek Seekings - Surrey Heath Borough Council Licensing

Rab explained that the reason for the meeting was due to BP having submitted 2 applications in order that BP's in Mytchett and Bagshot could increase their alcohol licence to 24 hours. At the present time, Inspector Darkens was against any increase due to the crime stats being so high which affected the overall crime figures for Surrey Heath. The offences mentioned were making off without payments (MOWP) thefts of alcohol from within the shop and other miscellaneous thefts, again from within the shop.

A print out of the crime numbers with details was handed out which covered 18 months.

Bagshot – MOWP 57, miscellaneous thefts 64, theft of alcohol 14 = 135 crimes

Mytchett – MOWP 56, miscellaneous thefts 39, thefts of alcohol 34 = 129 crimes.

The Lightwater store did not suffer as many thefts as the other 2.

BP was seen as an easy target for drive offs as other 24 hour garages suffered less crime.

Police would be objecting to the applications but there were no representations at present until this meeting was held. Ultimately if things didn't improve, the licences would be reviewed. Mr Botkai stated that he hoped police would speak to him first before any licence review took place.

Security guards were suggested or the ability to only "pay at the pump", however this would mean that customers did not need to enter the shop which would impact on sales figures and BP had no intention of introducing this method. BP's app that allowed customers to pay via their mobile phone was discussed that it didn't work very well.

It was discussed that security guards couldn't physically challenge anyone caught stealing, however an SIA door supervisor has the power to both stop people and detain them.

Mr Botkai stated that due to the M&S shops attached to the BP garage being successful, ie they were well staffed and stocked superior goods, they would attract an element of theft but that BP wanted to work with police to try and solve the problem.

Rab reiterated that there would be no representations made until after the meeting as BP's intentions needed to be listened to and made the suggestion that the applications be withdrawn by BP until any improvements are made and after that time, applications be re-submitted.

He was assured that M&S have the say on the layout of the shop but that would work with BP should changes be needed.

Mr Botaki stated that a number of stores with 24 hour licences which were only trading from 8am-11pm were trialled to sell alcohol for 24 hours. It was a successful exercise and had zero impact on theft figures.

100 applications were then made with all but one being granted. 15 hearings were held with residents being worried about noise but no negative feedback has since been received. There are now 117 24 hour premises operating.

A locked door policy where customers can only pay via the kiosk window could create more noise than if customers entered the shop. All BP shops have a remote door opening policy meaning that BP staff could decide whether customers were allowed into the shop at night or had to use the window. The door was otherwise kept locked and known criminals kept out. Having the door permanently locked meant that impact on theft was negligible.

Make offs were seen to be a geographical problem and didn't impact on any drinks licence. Solutions would need to be discussed.

Thefts – the position of the drinks and high value goods would need to be moved or locked away. In other stores, alcohol is locked in glass cabinets and floor layouts have been changed.

Bagshot had already removed steaks from their shelves which was the target of thefts in the past but Derek Seekings stated that both BPs were always discussed during the weekly meetings he held with the Environmental Health Officers. Champagne was the target at the Mytchett store where as Bagshot was miscellaneous thefts.

At the moment drinks are covered out of sight after licensing hours.

PS Turner stated that both locations had good transport links for MOWP's so it would always be problematic and wondered whether BP would consider introducing a policy where thefts under a certain amount would not be reported to police. High value thefts would of course be dealt with.

Mr Botaki stated that even if the theft was regarded as a civil matter, it was still a theft that was occurring. This could backfire if members of the public learnt about the reporting threshold and that it didn't actually deal with the problem of thefts occurring.

Mr Botaki spoke of a company who traced the drivers of MOWPs to ascertain if the drive off before payment was accidental. He would take this idea back to discuss the possibility.

The withdrawal of the applications was again discussed with Derek Seekings suggesting a TENs which was rejected due to the crime stats.

Mr Botaki suggested a licence variation for 8 months with a review being held after 6 months to assess the situation with the police making their final decision at that time. PS Turner agreed that this was a good idea and that it gives BP time to put steps in place. After 6 months BP would re contact the police and re submit the applications. This would be at a high cost and risk to BP but it would show commitment and evidence any problems that still existed. If it didn't reduce the problems then BP would shelve the idea of 24 hour licence.

Derek Seekings would tell the local councillors this weekend about the variation application.

Rab reiterated that it was unlikely that MOWP's would cease but thefts from inside the shop could be addressed by altering the layout, and securing certain goods. It was discussed that staff working at the tills could not physically see who was in the shop. A refit of the shop was due in January.

Sam reiterated the possibility of a value threshold before reporting a theft.

Mr Botaki suggested a liaison officer/SPOC for any follow ups as he would like a good relationship between police and BP.

Both BP's had recently passed test purchase operations.

Mr Botaki would take all suggestions from this meeting back to discuss and it was felt that dramatic changes could be achieved with some alterations.

Rab would discuss this meeting with Inspector Darkens and confirmed that there was no rush for Police to put in representations and would wait until he heard back from BP regarding the steps they were taking before making a decision whether to or not.
