Please state the ground(s) for review (please read guidance note 1) Surrey police are seeking a review of the premises licence under the grounds of prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the protection of children from harm Police attended the premises on Wednesday the 2 nd January 2019 due to the report of an robbery. While carrying out their enquiries Police found that the premises was in a breach of a number of its licensing conditions that are on the premises licence, a number of which involve the CCTV system which was not working at the time. Due to the CCTV system not working and the non-cooperation of the owner Police enquiries were limited in trying to identify the suspects.

Surrey Police are reviewing the premises licence at Bargain Beers & Wine Off Licence convenience store situated at 126 Frimley Road, Camberley, Surrey. The reasons leading up to the review are as follows:-

On Wednesday 2nd January 2019 police attended the premises due to a report that a robbery had taken place at the premises and a large amount of cigarettes had been stolen.

Police officers arrived at the scene and they spoke to members of staff at the shop, a Mr Tajinder Jandu. Mr Tajinder gave his account of the incident. When officers made enquiries regarding the CCTV, Mr Jandu stated that the CCTV was not working so there was no footage of the offenders during the incident. Officers who attended the scene made enquiries in the local area which included premises with CCTV cameras but no trace of the suspects could be seen in the local area.

The Licensing Officer, Rab Carnie, made contact with the premises licence holder, Mr Harpreet Singh, on Friday 4th January and to his amazement, he was not aware of the robbery as staff at the shop had not informed him.

Mr Singh informed the licensing officer that he could not attend the premises until Wednesday 9th January to which he was informed that this was unacceptable as the police needed him to check the CCTV to confirm that it was not working as the staff at the shop did not know how to work the system, however Mr Singh insisted that he would not attend until the 9th January.

On Wednesday 9th January, the licensing officer and the investigating police officer, PC Gallagher, attended the premises and saw the owner of the premises, Mr Harpreet Singh, along with 2 members of staff, Mr Jandu and Mr Kapoor. Mr S ingh confirmed that the CCTV was not working at the time of the incident. The licensing officer, Rab Carnie, asked Mr Singh if he was aware of the premises licensing conditions which are on his premises licence and he stated he was not. The licensing officer stated "As the DPS (Designated Premises Supervisor) you need to be aware of your licensing conditions because due to your CCTV not working at the time of the incident on 2nd January you are in breach of the licence conditions regarding CCTV".

The licensing officer had a copy of the premises licence with him and he stated to Mr Singh "Your premises licence clearly states the following The system shall be maintinaed in good working order and at all times when the premises is open to the public and be fully operational covering both internal and external areas of the premises to which the public have access.

The licensing officer then asked the owner to show him all his staff training records but there were none. The licensing officer then asked Mr Jandu if he had a personal licence and he stated no. The licensing officer asked Mr Kapoor and Mr Jandu if they had received any licensing training and both replied "No" and Mr Jandu also stated that he had worked at the shop for about 6 months.

The licensing officer then asked to see the refusal book. A book was handed over but there were no records of any refusals being recorded within it.

The licensing officer then questioned Mr Jandu about what he would do if a young person tried to buy alcohol and it was very clear that he was unsure what to do.

The licensing officer informed Mr Singh that he was also in breach of his licence by not having any staff training records and for not keeping records of any refusals of alcohol.

It was very clear that the management were not complying with the following conditions on the premises licence 1, 4, 5, 6, 15 and 16 and it was also very clear that the staff had not had any training regarding the Licensing Act 2003.

The police are very concerned due to the lack of supervision by the owner Mr Singh, who is also the designated premises supervisor.

A very serious incident occurred at the premises and due to the incompetence of the management and staff the police enquiries were severely hindered.

All police statements are attached to the review papers and a copy of the premises licence is also attached.

The police would like the committee to consider the following recommendations:-

- 1. Revoke the premises licence
- 2. If the committee decide not to revoke the licence then consider suspending the premises licence for a length of time that the committee feel appropriate.
- 3. Remove the current DPS Mr Harpeet Singh as the police feel he is not a fit and proper person to hold the position of the designated premises supervisor.
- 4. A condition be placed on the premises licence stating that a personal licence holder will be working at the premises at all times when the premises is open for licensing activities.



This statement refers to a time when I attended 126 Frimley Road, BARGAIN BEERS AND WINE to take a report of a Robbery.

On Wednesday 2 January 2019 I was on duty in uniform in a marked Police vehicle in company of PC FANTHAM 3559 call sign SH80. Police were called by an informant to state that BARGAIN BEERS AND WINE had been robbed approximately 20 minutes before the call was made. When I attended the location at 20:45 I was met with a male I know to be Tajinder JANDU who stated that he had been working in the shop alone when he two males walked into the shop and one of them told him to follow him or he would kill him. JANDU walked with the male and stood around the back of the fridges at the back of the location whilst the other males stole several bottles of alcohol and cigarettes from behind the counter. Once a statement had been taken from JANDU he was asked if there was anyone else working with him at the time or if there was any CCTV in the premises that would assist me with my investigation. JANDU said that there is CCTV at the location but it was not working at the time of the incident due to a cable being loose. I could clearly see that there was no moving picture on the monitor at the front of the shop. JANDU also confirmed that there was no one else working with him at the shop that day and he was alone.

I then re-attended the location on Wednesday 9th January 2019 at 14:00 with the licensing officer Rab CARNIE and was met by the owner of the shop MR SINGH. He had previously informed officers that there was working CCTV at the location and he had not been told any different by JANDU.
