LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE - 19 November 2018

The Application

This is an application by BP Connect for a variation to the premises licence at BP Connect Filling Station, 40 London Road, Bagshot SU19 5HL. Representations have been received from one "Responsible Authority" and from one "other persons".

Evidence before the Sub-Committee

Representations have been received from one 'Other Persons', namely Mr K Clarke. Mr Clarke was not present at the hearing and his concerns were formally noted and recorded. He submitted a Regulation 8 Notice. This representation has been accepted by the Committee as read.

The Police Authority has made representations as a "Responsible Authority" that there were a significant number of crimes connected with premises at BP connect Bagshot. The timings span across the day and include alcohol theft even outside the current licencing hours. This Application is therefore likely in their view to increase the likelihood of crime.

Oral representations were made by Mr. Botkai on behalf of the Applicant.

Mr. Botkai commenced his presentation by referring to paragraphs 1-89 and 95-138 of the Council's Licencing Policy Statement and from the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, dated April 2018. He then directed the Committee to the Police crime data at p.30 of the agenda. Mr. Botkai confirmed that there is a remote door opening policy at night which will be in operation at the premises; this is operator controlled and never used if there is a single man on duty. He also stated that BP Connect want to improve and reduce crime and work with the police on this

basis. He offered that a security guard could be employed by agreement with the police for a 3 month period with varying hours to break the cycle of theft.

Mr. Botkai offered a proposal for a temporary variation to the licence for an 8 month period to be subject to a review from 6 months and that an Application for permanent variation of the licence would potentially follow a successful review. Mr. Botkai highlighted that if there was a spike in crime with the new temporary variation to the licence that BP would wish to revert to the original licence conditions as it is a responsible retailer and would not wish to suffer reputational damage. Mr. Botkai stated that BP Connect will robustly promote the four licensing objectives. Mr. Botkai concluded his presentation by requesting the licence be granted or for a temporary grant to be considered should a permanent grant not be favoured.

Councillor Chapman asked Mr. Botkai to clarify how the door opening procedure is operated at night if there is 1 man on duty only. Mr. Botkai responded that the door will simply remain locked in these circumstances and that purchase of items can be done from the secure night console.

Councillor Lewis requested to know if there was any data held for unreported theft and Mr. Botkai was unable to provide any such data.

The Chairman, Councillor Winterton asked Mr. Botkai how items were purchased when the door was locked at night and Mr. Botkai explained that the cashier goes within the store for the item. Councillor Winterton asked if there is a concern about more than one customer causing a distraction to assist theft by another customer but Mr. Botkai asserted that the facts do not support this and although it could happen, the facts showed that theft generally occurs early in the evening when the store it at its busiest.

The Decision

The Licensing Act encourages us to view our powers and responsibilities in the light of the community as a whole. The regime under the Act has a light touch approach to regulation and we carry out functions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, having regard to the statutory guidance and to the Statement of Licensing Policy.

If the sub-committee is minded to attach any conditions to the proposed licence, these must be appropriate to promote one or more licensing objectives. They must be proportionate in that they are tailored to the activities taking place, the size, location, type and characteristics of the business and do not repeat those which duplicate other statutory provisions.

We will consider the licensing objectives in the following order:

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

We note the concerns of the 'Responsible Authority' regarding crime and disorder but the Committee are satisfied that no evidence has been provided that this objective will be undermined. The Committee feel that the conditions proposed by the Applicant in the Operating Schedule are adequate to address any concerns and will be enforceable by BP Connect. We are also mindful that any Licence granted can be reviewed under the Act.

The Protection of children from harm

We have had regard to the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy which states that the Council will have particular regard to the safety of children when considering licence applications. It is a mandatory condition that all premises must have an age verification policy. The existing measures that the applicant operates are more than satisfactory to meet the requirements of the Statement of Licensing Policy and legislation in the Committees opinion.

Public Safety

There is no evidence before us upon which we can consider that this objective is not likely to be promoted.

Prevention of public nuisance

No objection was raised by Environmental Health as a statutory responsible authority with regards to public nuisance. Whist the written concerns of 'other persons' have been noted, there is no evidence before us that the premises will create the circumstances to which they refer to.

We therefore grant the Licence subject to the following conditions:

Conditions

We have had regard to whether conditions are appropriate in accordance with the guidance and the licensing policy and note those offered by the Applicant in the operating schedule. In summary, we find it is appropriate to grant the temporary variation to the licence for a period of 8 months, with two conditions attached, being:

- 1 If there is only one member of staff on duty between 0000 and 0500, the entrance door to the shop will be closed to customers and any sales between these hours will be made through the night pay window.
- 2 Where there is more than one member of staff on duty between the hours of 0000 and 0500, a remote door lock facility will be in use for all admissions of customers entering the premises and all customers entering the premises will be monitored.

These conditions are consistent with the proposed operating schedule, the wording to be determined by the Licensing Officer and Chairman of the Committee and to be provided to the Applicant within 5 working days.
