Please state the ground(s) for review (please read guidance note 1) Camberley police are seeking a review of the premises licence under the grounds of prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm Camberley Police and Surrey Heath Borough Council licensing department carried out two joint test purchase operations within a 3 month period the first was on Wednesday 9th September 2015 and the 2nd on the 19th November 2015. The person failing the sales by selling alcohol to an underage person on both occasions was the owner and also the designated premises supervisor Mr Ravel Singh Motizada. Mr Motizada failed to ask for identification on both the test purchases and he sold alcohol to the underage persons.

J K Wines is a small off licence confectionary shop situated at 5 Bagshot High Street Bagshot GU15 5AG. The designated premises supervisor is the owner of the premises a Mr Ravel Singh Motizada

The details of the two offences are as follows

On Wednesday the 9th September 2015 Camberley Police carried out a joint test purchase operation with Surrey Heath Borough Council's licensing department. One of the premises that was tested on the night was J K Wines of 5 High Street Bagshot. The person working in the shop at the time of the test purchase was the designated premises supervisor Mr Motizada.

At 17:50 hours two 16 year old female test purchasers entered the shop and one of the girls attempted to buy alcohol, At no time did Mr Motizada ask for any identification he went ahead and sold the girl a bottle of white wine. The incident was witnessed by a plain clothes Police officer special constable 6434 Lee Welch Surrey Heath licensing officer Rab Carnie attended the premises shortly after the incident with Police constables 2993 Natalie Pattison. The plain clothed officer then related the facts of the offence to the uniformed officers in the presence and hearing of Mr Motizada. Mr Motizada admitted the offence and he was issued with an £90 fixed penalty ticket for selling alcohol to a person under 18 years of age

The 2nd test purchase was again a joint operation with Surrey Heath Borough Council's licensing department

On Thursday the 19th November 2015 at 19:40 hours two underage test purchasers entered the shop, Mr Motizada was again working behind the counter one of the young female test puchaser was attempting to buy a bottle of white wine. At no time did Mr Motizada ask for any identification and he sold the girl the bottle of wine The incident was witnessed by Special constable 6174 Bernard Whitney and Police Support Officer 14079 Sue Spencer

Surrey Police licensing officer Rab Carnie along with Surrey Heath Licensing Officer Derek Seekings attended the premises shortly after the incident and informed Mr Motizada that he had failed another test purchase. Police constable 40204 Debbie Haydon and Police Sergeant Sandra Carlier also attended. The plain clothed officers then related the offence to the uniformed officers in the presence and hearing of Mr Motizada. Due to Mr Motizada already having been issued with an fixed penalty notice for a similar offence on the 9th September 2015 he was not eligible for another fixed penalty notice so he was reported for the offence by Police Constable Haydon.

Surrey Police works very closely with the licensing trade but where we receive intelligence or concerns from the community that standards at a premises are not being maintained we will seek to prosecute with our colleagues from Surrey Heath Borough Council and Trading Standards.

"Poorly run premises often have a negative impact on a community and this is one of the tactics we use and will continue to use to deal with any premises that falls below the required standard. Should any premise fail two test purchases within a three month period, they could risk prosecution and a review of its licence.as in this case

"It is a proven fact that the misuse of alcohol is a factor in leading young people to behave in an anti-social manner and those businesses that have a licence to sell alcohol have a responsibility to ensure that the conditions of that licence, and the law are upheld."

It was the decision of the Borough inspector Jon Castell that although Mr Motizada was reported for the offence it would be better to deal with premises by reviewing the

premises licence due to the designated premises supervisor being the one failing both test purchases

The Police would like to make the following recommendations to the licensing committee

1) To revoke the premises licence

If the committee decide not to revoke the licence then to consider suspending the licence for a period of time that the committee feel appropriate

2)To remove the current designated premises supervisor

To remove all current licensing conditions and them to be replaced with the following

General

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol shall be trained in accordance with the premises licence holders training procedures

All staff shall receive suitable training including refresher training in relation to challenge 25 proof of age policy which shall be applied to the premises

Crime and disorder

- 1) A personal licence holder will always be on duty at the premises during the hours that the premises can sell alcohol
- 2) The following CCTV conditions be placed on the licence
 Appropriate digital CCTV equipment and a sufficient number of cameras shall be
 installed and maintained at the premises to record colour images that are clear
 enough to allow the Police to use them to investigate any crimes that are committed
 on the premises. The areas covered by the cameras will cover all areas within the
 premises that are open to the public

A camera will be positioned to obtain images of persons entering the building by the main entrance

- 3)No persons other than the Police, the licensing authority, the premise licensing holder the manager or authorised person shall have access to the CCTV recording equipment or the recordings made from such equipment. The CCTV system will be in operation and recording whenever the premises are open to the public.
- 4)Recordings made on the CCTV system shall be retained for a period of at least 28 days of recording
- 5)A minimum of 2 notices stating that CCTV is in operation shall be displayed throughout the premises where the public have access. The notices shall be at least A4 size
- 6) All staff who serve alcohol shall be authorised to sell the alcohol by a person who works at the premises who is the holder of a personal licence
- 7) Any person who appears to look under 25 shall be challenged and asked for identification to prove that they are over 18
- 1) A refusals book shall be kept at the premises and a record must be kept of all persons that are refused the sale of alcohol and this book must be made available if requested by the Police

Public Safety

- 8)All notices in relation to public health and safety will be prominently displayed at the premises
- 2)The management will also ensure the premises will be operated in line with Health & Safety Act and any environmental health issues will be the responsibility of the Premises licence holder
- 3)The manager shall be responsible for conducting a Fire Risk assessment and also a Health and Safety Risk Assessment for the licensed premises

Prevention of A Public Nuisance

1)In the event of any anti social behaviour inside the premises the manager/duty manager will make any CCTV recordings available to the local Police on request

Protection of children from harm

- 1)There shall be a think challenge 25 policy in place
- 2)All staff shall receive regular refresher training on the corporate "Think 25 policy.
- 3)The think 25 policy shall be brought to the attention of the customer through the point of sale by material displayed
