From experience it is very easy for minors to buy alcohol and tobacco from convenience stores, however proper off licenses tend to be stricter and so underage drinking is rare; an issue that in today's culture is something we as a country are trying to cut down on! I feel with the many pubs around the village and the one off license there seems no need to add another. It'll increase crime as minors will have another outlet in which to try and buy alcohol.
